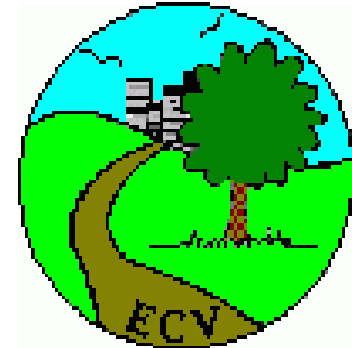

# Enfield Conservation Volunteers AUTUMN

## SEPTEMBER

### Sunday 1 September Pymmes Park

A return visit to continue opening up the copses to allow more light in which should help deter unwanted elements in the park.
